

INTRODUCTION

On 5-7 November 2024, in Batumi, Ajara Autonomous Republic (Georgia), the <u>CPMR</u> will organize, in the framework of the project <u>PREP4BLUE</u>, and in partnership with the <u>CNR</u>, a pilot stakeholder assembly to showcase the role of research and innovation for the preservation and restoration of marine ecosystems and biodiversity in the Danube Delta and the Black Sea.

This Mission Ocean event is organised in collaboration with the Danube and Black Sea lighthouse and notably the **<u>EcoDaLLi</u>** project.

Through a world café format, stakeholders will co-create a specific roadmap fixing the priorities in terms of research and innovation for the preservation and restoration of the Black Sea and its connection to the Danube and the EU Mission Ocean & Waters. The roadmap will be incorporated into the Danube Innovation Strategic Action Plan, the main outcome of the project EcoDaLLi

Kindly hosted by the **Batumi State Maritime Academy**, this major event will gather relevant quadruple helix actors from the Black Sea and the Danube, and will help to connect Black Sea actors with the EU Mission Danube & Black Sea lighthouse.
