CMA and Blue Entrepreneurship – online event and conclusions

On 25 May 2021 a regional webinar on supporting the priorities of the Common Maritime Agenda (CMA) through research and innovation took place, organised by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Turkey, co-chaired by the Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure of the Republic of Turkey, and supported by the European Commission. More precisely, this online event, which welcomed over 116 participants from all corners of the Black Sea, explored how this topic could contribute to cultivating the region's potential for Blue Entrepreneurship.

This technical study by the European MSP Platform highlights existing initiatives and forms of multi-use at sea in Europe and provides proposals to reduce licencing obstacles to its deployment. Based on best practice, this technical study provides tools for the implementation of CMA Goal II: A competitive, innovative and sustainable blue economy for the Black Sea, through the development of synergies between blue economy sectors.

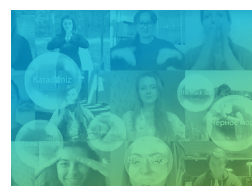
